

Cookies Policy

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1. What is a cookie

A cookie is a small piece of data or message that is sent from an organisation's web server to your web browser and is then stored on your hard drive. Cookies cannot read data off your hard drive or cookie files created by other sites, and do not damage your system.

2. Different Categories of cookies

- Necessary cookies: They help to make a website usable by enabling basic functions like page navigation and access to secure areas of the website. The website cannot function properly without these cookies.
- Session cookies: They are stored temporarily on a user's device to gather information in relation to the browsing activity and input information of the user within the website. This is to remember user's input information, to avoid re-entering such information. As soon as the user closes the browser, session cookies are deleted from his device.
- Statistic cookies: They help website owners to understand how visitors interact with websites by collecting and reporting information anonymously

Cookie Type	Cookie Name	Purpose
Google Analytics	_gat_UA-*	Limits recording data by Google analytics on high demand web sites. Prevents overloading of Google analytics service.
Google Analytics	_gid	The cookie is used by Google analytics to store information regarding visitor's usage of the website. It helps to create website analysis report. Data, such as number of visitors, connection source, and visited pages is being collected in anonymous format.
Google Analytics	_ga	The cookie is used by Google analytics for site usage tracking. It collects number of visitors, user sessions and companies if applicable. Collected data helps to compose analytical reports. The data is being stored in anonymous format, using randomly generated numbers, assigned to each unique visitor.
